

New Illinois Law Requires State to Notify of Off-Site Releases and Gives State Controversial Authority to Compel Clean-ups

On July 27th, Governor Blagojevich signed into a law a significant amendment affecting virtually all present and past owners, lessees, and users of property at which an environmental release has occurred. The new law requires the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency to notify off-site property owners if contamination from a release extends beyond the property line and grants IEPA broad – and controversial – authority to compel the remediation of off-site clean-ups.
